



For ART MIAMI 2023, Roberta Coni has imagined an artistic journey, an anthology, inspired by the main themes and models that have marked her art for last 10 years. The exhibition opens with "GIORGIA WITH BLACK CHERRIES", a contemporary reinterpretation of the iconic "GABRIELLE D'ESTRÉES ET SA SŒUR", painted in the late 1500s by an unknown artist from the Fontainebleau School. Through this creation featuring her sister - her very first model - Roberta Coni reaffirms her admiration for the Renaissance and its Grand Masters, the true roots of her art.

Continuing her artistic odyssey, the artist presents "OSAS TRIPTYQUE", immersing us in the history and culture of her second model. From the Renaissance turban to the Nigerian *gele*, this fabric has always had a symbolic significance in the work of the Italian artist. Through this painting, Roberta Coni highlights the political aspect and intrinsic language of the turban during slavery: the choice of fabric and the way it was tied revealed information about a person's belonging, social or civil status, and state of mind. An emblem of redemption at the time of the abolition of slavery, the turban has now become a characteristic accessory for African women, underlining their triumph over obscurantism.

Omnipresent in her artworks, the turban is inherent in Roberta Coni's personal history. Highly allegorical, it evokes revenge on pain and illness, and the transformation of difficult moments - which many people, like her, overcome - into moments of joy and hope. In her portraits of "CHARLOTTE", "ALICE", "GI-GI" and "LAURA", beetles, butterflies and flowers are depicted on the fabric. The beetle painted on the face of 'GI-GI' symbolises rebirth, light triumphing over darkness and life over death. Since the dawn of time, the butterfly has been the symbol of lightness and beauty, but also of the brevity of life... A sign of renewal, it evokes the possibility of the human soul transforming itself...

This artistic epic ends with "LAURA PRIMAVERA". The crown of roses adorning her turban embodies the purity of the divine, the magic of creation and beauty in its noblest form. Its thorns, meanwhile, underline the suffering that lies behind every personal journey. « For me, beauty is always associated with a profound concept linked to our personal history, which makes us all unique, not perfect, but luminous. When this light of consciousness is kindled within us, nothing disappears, everything is transformed and remains. » - confides the artist

ROBERTA CONI


Roberta Coni was born in Marino (Rome) in 1976. She graduated from the Academy of Fine Arts in Rome in 1999. She studied in Spain and the United States. Primarily interested in the human figure, she mixes the classical technique of oil painting with heavy body paste made of bitumen, melted wax and glue.

Since 2009, her artistic research has been geared toward large-scale paintings, in which the face often emerges from the shadows. An interpretation of the contemplative soul aimed in continuous introspection. Her work is characterized by its strong realism while combining rougher materials. We discover female figures with poignant expressions, faces in the foreground, with detailed attention, almost lenticular. The brush focuses on the skin and eyes, and in particular to the secret pulse of the pictorial surface. The faces are often marked by time flowing relentlessly on the skin, deforming and shaping it over the years, to reveal the soul. She has created a compendium of contemporary work as she integrates video with the visual language of her paintings.



THE POWER OF 'LILITH' IN THE WORK OF GABRIEL MORENO: THROUGH THE EYES OF THE FEMME FATALE

Born and created in the same original way as Adam, Lilith is his first wife. Unable to find harmony together, she leaves Eden for the shores of the Red Sea where, surrounded by numerous demons, she gives in to lust. Characterised by her imperious rebellion, she does not correspond to the feminine ideal. A femme fatale, free and seductive, she has been shown naked and provocative throughout the history of art.

For ART MIAMI 2023, Gabriel Moreno is reinterpreting the myth of the goddess turned demoness by presenting a contemporary 'LILITH', looking directly at the viewer. Independent, sensual and deliciously rebellious, she embodies all the values of the femme fatale, defying the dictates of patriarchy.

His bold use of colour, his imagination and his modern and unstructured style have earned him the opportunity to work for the largest advertising agencies. WILLING TO ANSWER INTERVIEW REQUESTS

Son of Oscar-winning actor Anthony Quinn, Lorenzo Quinn was born in 1966 in Rome. With his father, he discovered the Catalan surrealist figures who attracted him and awakened his imagination. After studying at the New York Academy of Fine Arts and a brief career as an actor, where he played Salvador Dalí, he devoted himself fully to his art.

Sculpting by observing the energy of life, Lorenzo Quinn's creative ideas come quickly. He generally conceives each work in writing: a poetic text is associated with each of his projects.

The contemporary Italian sculptor has gained international recognition in recent years. He is particularly noted for his skilful use of the hands in his works, which convey genuine emotion as well as concepts such as love and faith.

« I wanted to sculpt the part of the human body that is considered the most difficult and technically demanding. The hand has many powers, to love, to hate, to create, to destroy ».

Lorenzo Quinn's sculptures are exhibited in cities around the world, including major commissions from corporations and philanthropic organisations. Beyond being an artist, Lorenzo Quinn wishes to establish a dialogue with his viewers through an intelligible and universal language.
